Luke 18:1-14

- 1. Have you ever prayed repeatedly for something and not received it? As you feel comfortable, share with the group.
 - Allow time for sharing.
- 2. Where you are in your faith currently, is it easy or difficult to believe that God is listening to your prayers?
 - Allow time for sharing.
- 3. Luke says that Jesus tells the parable of the widow and the unjust judge so that people will keep praying and not lose heart. How does this parable encourage that?
 - If the widow could get justice from a judge who cared nothing for her or justice, how much more will God give justice to his beloved children? This parable uses a "from the lesser to the greater" type of argument if the lesser judge can do this, the greater Judge surely will.
- 4. What would "a full justice that goes all the way down" look like?
 - God cares about justice more than any of us, and so in bringing justice, he will bring it for every wrong that has ever been done little or big.
- 5. How does it make you feel to think that you are 'on the wrong side of the equation' like the tax collector; that we have all at times been oppressor and oppressed? Is this a hard truth for you?
 - This may be hard especially for people who have been deeply wronged. Try to make a safe space for whatever answers come out here.
- 6. The cross is the place where 'justice and mercy meet'. Is this a new thought for you? How do you understand it?
 - Allow time for sharing.
