LENT 4 | Taize Prayer & Praise Evening **6:30pm**

Taize-Style Worship

This service includes periods of silence to encourage peaceful communion with God. It is not an attempt to achieve inner silence at all costs by following some 'technique' that creates a kind of emptiness within. Instead, with a childlike trust, we let Christ pray silently within us.

"I have calmed and quieted my soul, like a weaned child with its mother."

Like the child whose sobs have ceased, held in its mother's arms, we simply 'be' in the presence of God. Prayer does not always need words, maybe not even thoughts.

Sometimes we are apparently silent, and yet great discussions go on within, struggling with imaginary partners or with ourselves. Calming our souls requires a kind of simplicity:

"I do not occupy myself with things too great and too marvellous for me."

Silence means recognizing that my worries can't do much. Silence means leaving to God what is beyond my reach and capacity. We acknowledge the thoughts or concerns that come to mind, and then let them go.

Lenten Confession

Dear friends in Christ, every year at the time of the Christian Passover we celebrate our redemption through the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Lent is a time to prepare for this celebration and to renew our life in Him. We continue in this holy season by remembering our need for repentance, and for the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Lord, to continue to observe a holy Lent by self-examination, penitence, prayer, fasting and almsgiving, and by reading and meditating on the word of God.

And so now let us either sit or kneel before our Creator and Redeemer, and confess our sins.

Heavenly Father, we praise you for adopting us as your children and making us heirs of eternal life. In your mercy you have washed us from our sins and made us clean in your sight. Yet we still fail to love you and serve you as we should. Forgive us our sins and renew us by your grace, that we may continue to grow as members of Christ, in whom alone is our salvation. Amen.

Readings

Ephesians 5:18b, 21, 6:1-9

- 18b ... Be filled with the Spirit, [...]
- ²¹ Submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ. [...]
- 6 ¹ Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. ² "Honour your father and mother" (this is the first commandment with a promise), ³ "that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land." ⁴ Parents, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.
- ⁵ Bondservants, obey your earthly masters with fear and trembling, with a sincere heart, as you would Christ, ⁶ not by the way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but as bondservants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart, ⁷ rendering service with a good will as to the Lord and not to humans, ⁸ knowing that whatever good anyone does, this they will receive back from the Lord, whether they are a bondservant or free. ⁹ Masters, do the same to them, and stop your threatening, knowing that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and that there is no partiality with him.

Matthew 23:1-12

¹ Then Jesus said to the crowds and to his disciples, ² "The scribes and the Pharisees sit on Moses' seat, ³ so do and observe whatever they tell you, but not the works they do. For they preach, but do not practice. ⁴ They tie up heavy burdens, hard to bear, and lay them on people's shoulders, but they themselves are not willing to move them with their finger. ⁵ They do all their deeds to be seen by others. For they make their phylacteries broad and their fringes long, ⁶ and they love the place of honour at feasts and the best seats in the synagogues ⁷ and greetings in the marketplaces and being called rabbi by others. ⁸ But you are not to be called rabbi, for you have one teacher, and you are all brothers and sisters. ⁹ And call no man your father on earth, for you have one Father, who is in heaven. ¹⁰ Neither be called instructors, for you have one instructor, the Christ. ¹¹ The greatest among you shall be your servant. ¹² Whoever exalts themselves will be humbled, and whoever humbles themselves will be exalted."
