Discussion Questions

- 1. Where do you most see the signs of the "domain of darkness" described in the sermon—either in the world around you or in your own patterns of thinking and living?
- 2. The world often tells us, "Save yourself." Which version of that message do you feel most often—avoid pain, protect your reputation, fulfil every desire, don't show weakness?
- 3. Why do you think acknowledging our own guilt, limits, or weakness is so central to stepping into the kingdom of light? What makes that kind of honesty challenging?
- 4. The repentant thief "saw" Jesus differently even in the midst of darkness. What helps you "turn the dial" toward God's kingdom when everything around you feels chaotic or loud?
- 5. Colossians says we have been transferred to the kingdom of the beloved Son. What does this "transfer of citizenship" look like in everyday life?
- 6. Where might Jesus be inviting you to stop trying to "save yourself" and instead trust Him? How could that surrender bring greater freedom?
