- Demonstrated enthusiasm and compassion for people and community.
- A proven leader in matters of mercy and justice.
- Ability to root their passions and goals within a rich biblical framework that is conversant with and sensitive to anti-racism, poverty reduction, and inclusion.
- Relevant academic training, and 3-5 yrs experience in community development or church leadership in a volunteer or paid capacity.
- Experience discerning gifts, equipping, and encouraging volunteer leaders.
- A proven team player as well as an independent and strategic thinker.
- Displays ability to negotiate a broad range of theological and political perspectives while being comfortable with ambiguity.

- Skilled in time management, organizing projects, and administration alongside excellent written and verbal communication skills.
- Flexible, including being able to work evenings and weekends
- Whether ordained in the Anglican Church of Canada, another Christian tradition or un-ordained we invite all who feel called to this ministry to apply. Our community is enriched by diverse backgrounds and experiences

ROLE RESPONSIBILITIES

Supporting Existing Justice Work (40%)

- Support the weekly Good Food Market: oversee its running through working with the coordinating team on strategic decisions; organise special events (e.g. Blessing of the Bikes; Christmas Market); liaise with staff, volunteers, and partners as necessary.
- Be staff support for other ongoing outreach ministries including but not limited to:
 - CAP (Christians Against Poverty) money course (1-2 times/year)
 - CIRP (Church in Regent Park) dinners (3-4 times/year)
 - Refugee Ministry
- Organize annual Advent & Lent outreach or fundraising opportunities
- Support outreach initiatives for other groups in the church as needed (e.g. youth, small groups)
- Liaise with Blackburn Bursary recipient & Provisions by Valerie meal program as necessary
- Continue building relationships with existing neighbourhood organizations (e.g. Building Roots, YSM (Yonge Street Mission), Good Shepherd Ministries)

Developing New Justice Initiatives (20%)

Prayerfully discern where the Spirit may be calling us to deepen in our love of our community for the sake of Kingdom work.

Participation in the overall ministry life of the Church (40%)

- Participate in weekly staff meetings (Tuesday 11:30am-1:30pm)
- Share in the pastoral care of the community
- Lead and preach at Sunday services as required
- Occasional services: Baptism, Marriage (if ordained), Funerals
- Shared planning and execution of yearly parish retreat
- Other duties as assigned by the Rector or his delegate
